






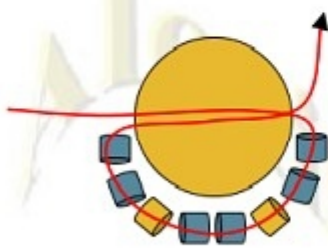

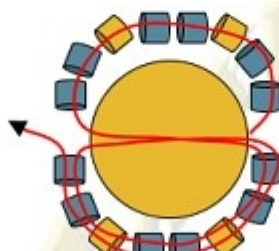
Materials

-  9/0 Seed Beads (SB)
-  Delicas Main Colour (MC)
-  Delicas Contrast Colour (CC)
-  Gumdrops
-  Thread in a matching colour – it does show a little bit in the corners

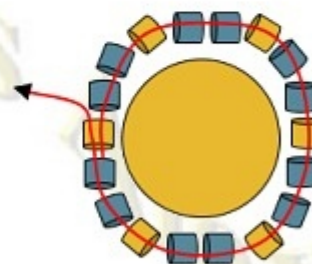
The bracelet is created in square stitch – with variations.



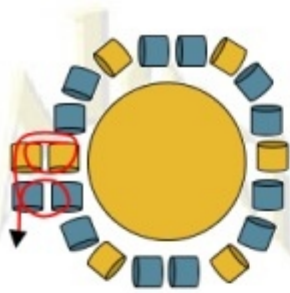
1. Take 1 Gumdrop, 2 MC, 1 CC, 2 MC, 1 CC and 2 MC, go again through the Gumdrop



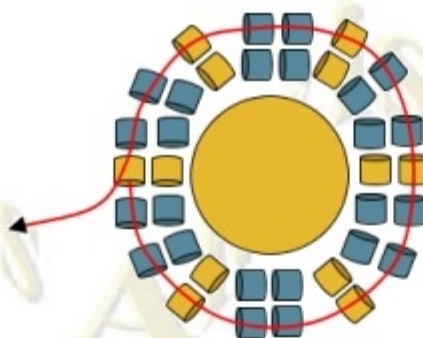
2. Add again 2 MC, 1 CC, 2 MC, 1 CC and 2 MC, go again through the Gumdrop and the beads added in the first step.



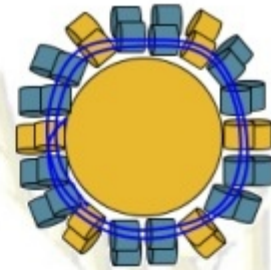
3. Add 1 CC, go through the beads of the second step, add 1 CC and go through the beads of the first step and the first CC of this step.



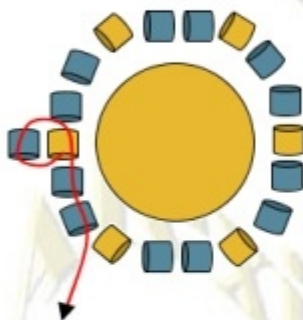
4. Add 1 CC, go through the existing CC and through the new CC. Add 1 MC, go through the existing MC and the new MC.



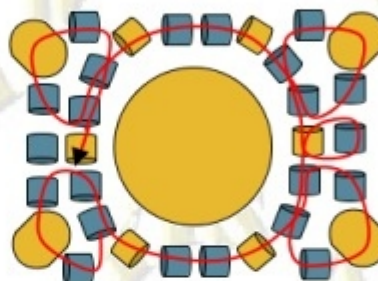
5. Go on in square stitch, taking care to create the new row below toward the flat bottom of the Gumdrops, adding beads in the same colour as the first row. At the end go again through the beads of this round.



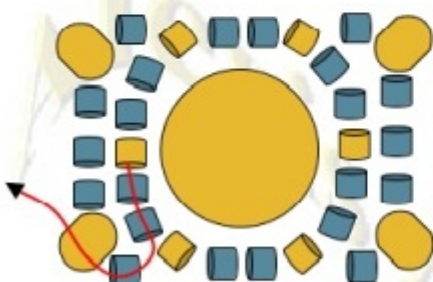
6. Use the starting tail to go through the upper (first) row and pull tight. Bury the tail by doing some square stitches through the beads and cut it off.



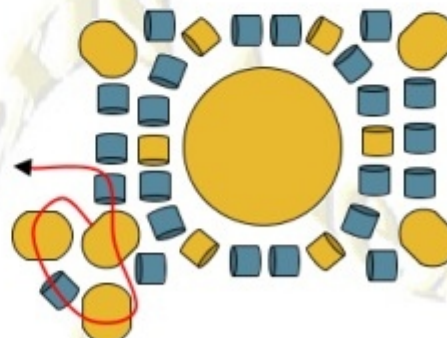
7. Working again from the lower round of beads: add 1 MC above the CC, go again through the CC and two more MC



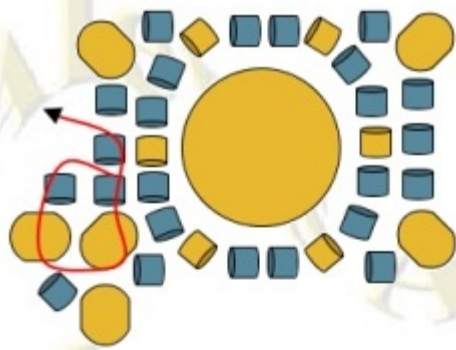
8. Add 1 MC, 1 SB and 1 MC, go through the existing two MC, the following CC, two MC, CC and two MC. Add again 1 MC, 1 SB and 1 MC. Add 1 MC above the following CC.



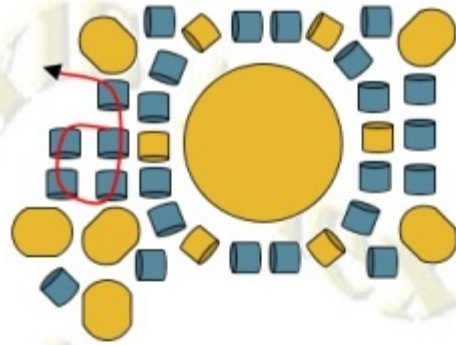
9. Finish by going through the first two beads of the first set of three beads



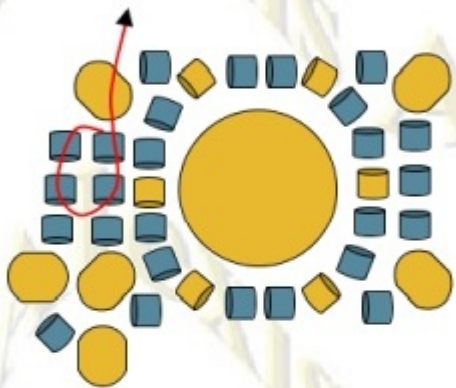
10. Add 1 SB, 1 MC and 1 SB above the SB and go through the next MC



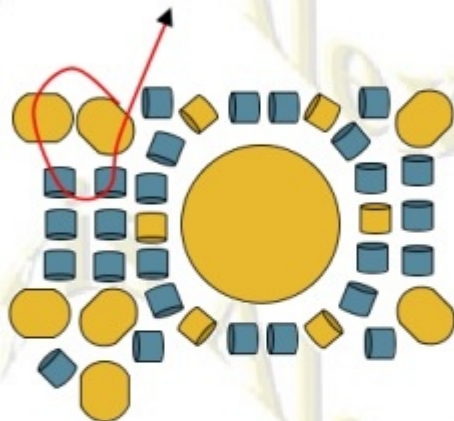
11. Add 1 MC, go through the SB of this row, the SB below and the next two MC



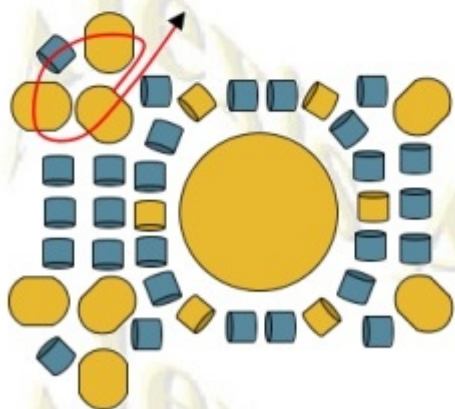
12. Add 1 MC in square stitch



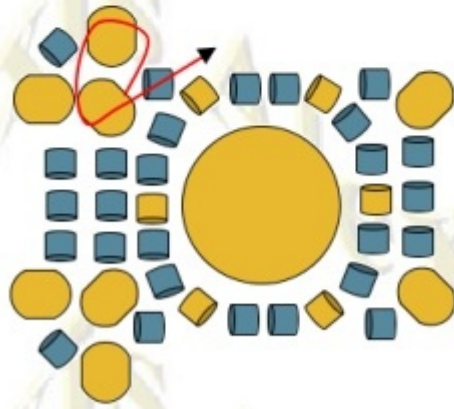
13. Add 1 MC in square stitch



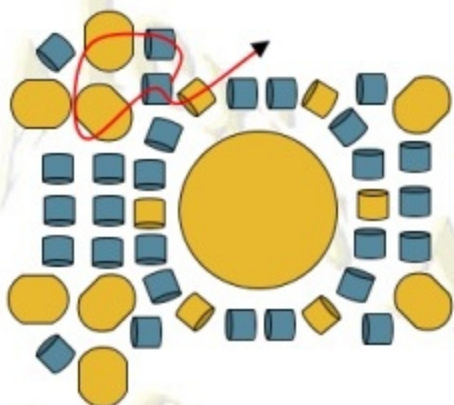
14. Add 1 SB



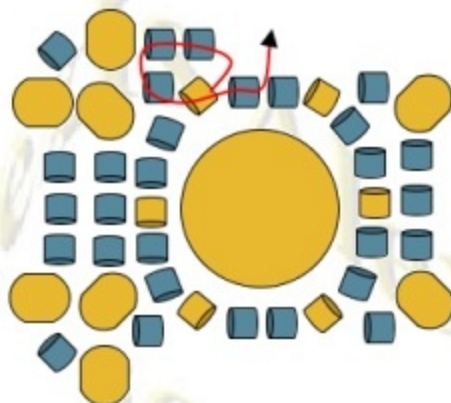
15. Add 1 SB and 1 MC



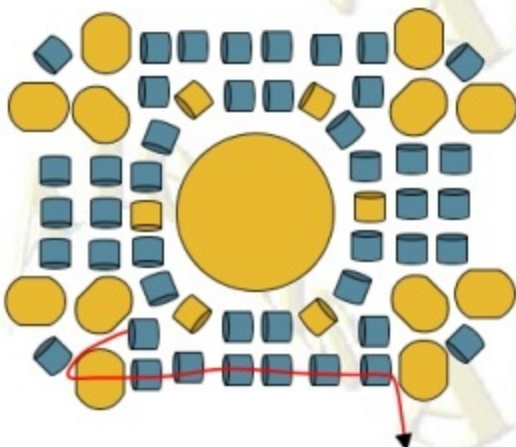
16. Go again through the last SB



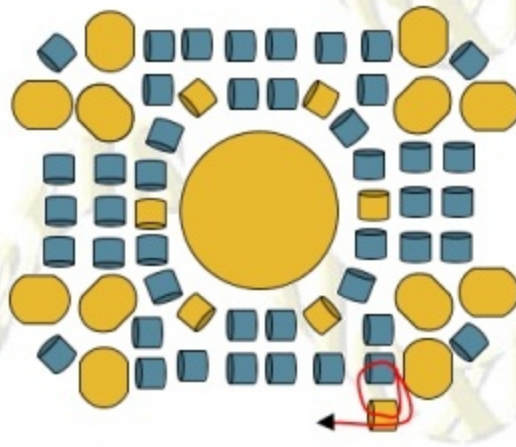
17. Add 1 MC



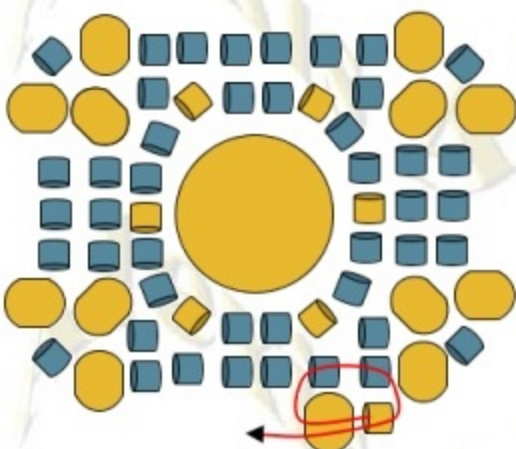
18. Add 1 MC above the CC



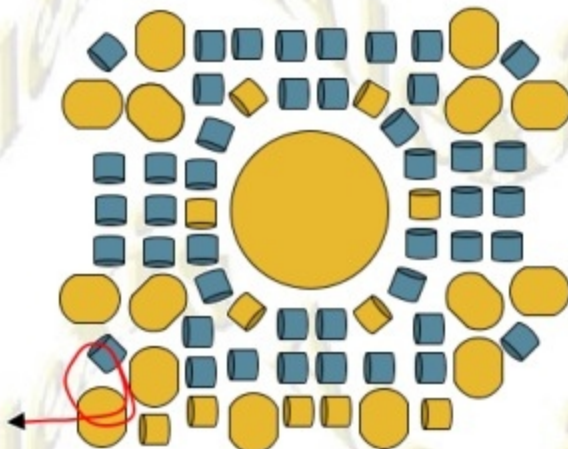
19. Add more MC, the corners are done with step 14 - 16
Finish with going back through the last beads – see diagram



20. Add 1 CC

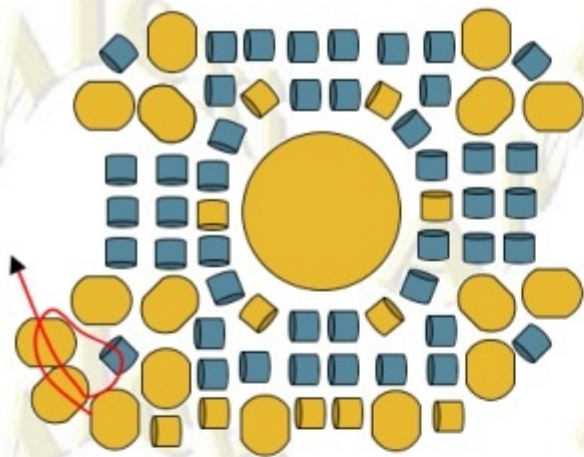


21. Add 1 SB

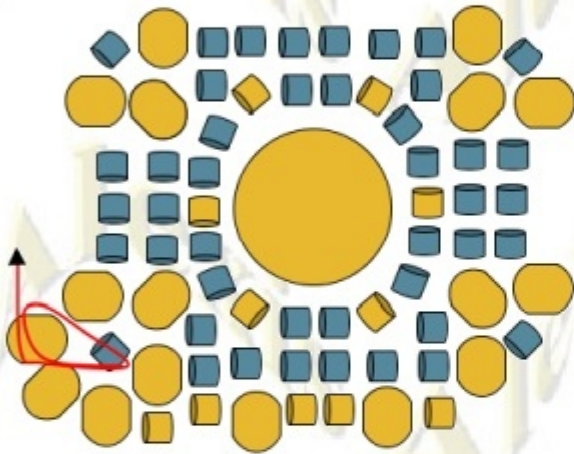


22. Add 2 CC, 1 SB, 2 CC and 1 SB

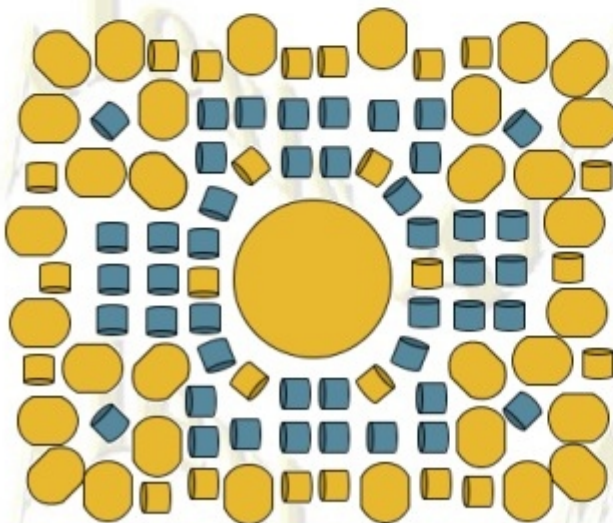
23. Add 2 SB

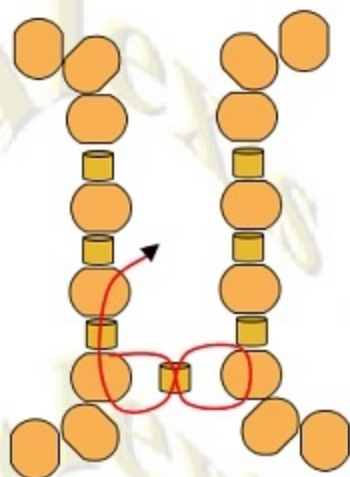


24. Go again through the last SB

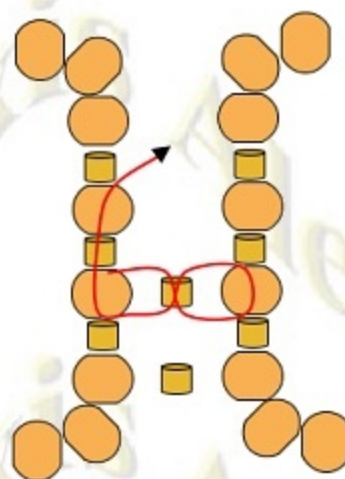


25. The finished part – at the long sides there are two CC between the R and at the short sides only one

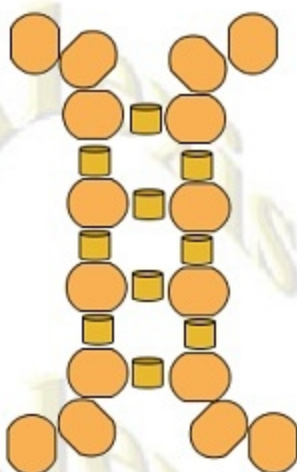




The connection between the parts – your thread is coming out of a corner SB and you add a new CC between the SBs by following a figure 8 thread path

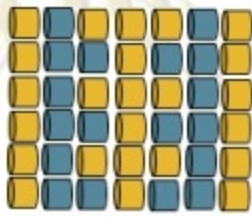


Adding the second CC between the parts

The closure



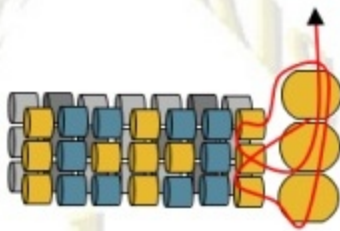
6 rows of square stitch

Flatten the piece

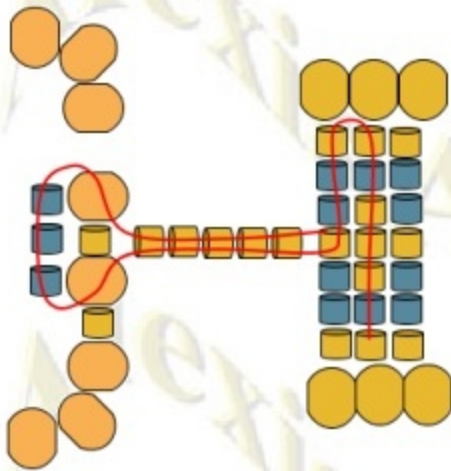


Attach SB to the sides in

brickstitch

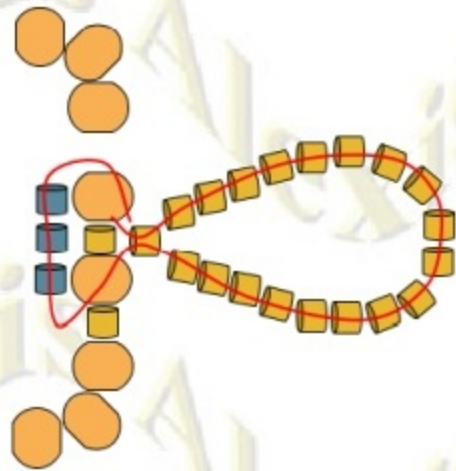


Add three SB – reverse the piece and attach the three
