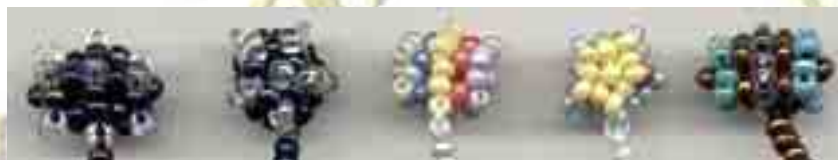


Beaded Beads

Part 3. „Pagoda bead“

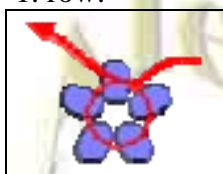

Materials:

Seed beads in five colours of the same size. My pagoda beads are made with size 11 seed beads. You can make these beads in one or two colours too, but for the first time I am recommending five colours for a better orientation.

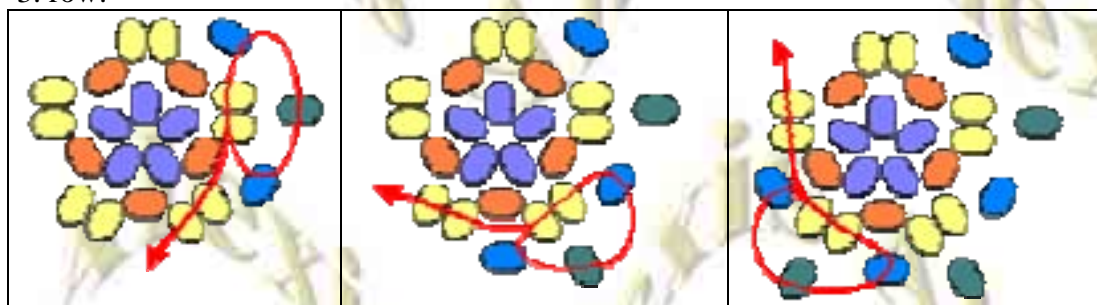
1. row:



2. row:

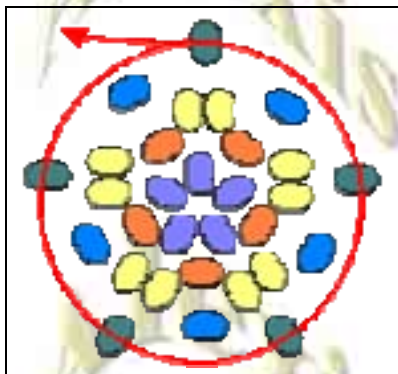


3. row:

It doesn't matter if the bead is a bit floppy at this stage – we will reinforce it with the embellishment.

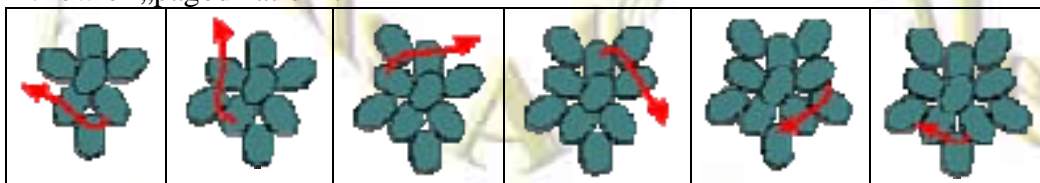
Seen from above and a side view:



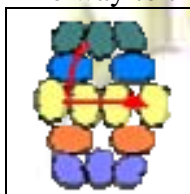
Closing the hole. If you want to string the bead on a necklace you should skip this step ☺.
The beads below are left out for better orientation:



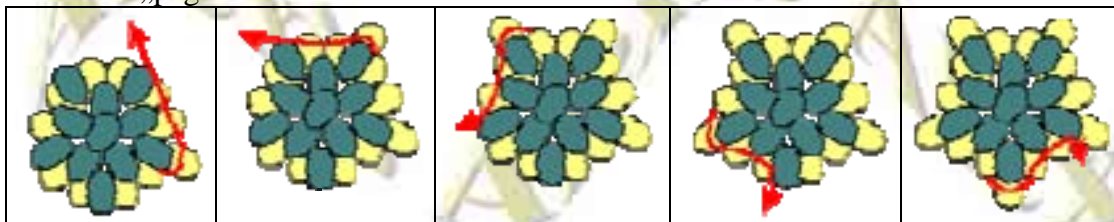
1. row of „pagodization“:



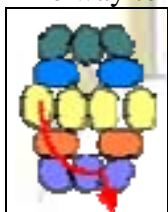
The way to the second row:



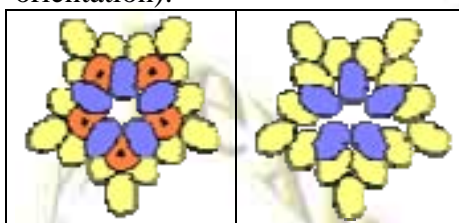
2. row of „pagodization“:



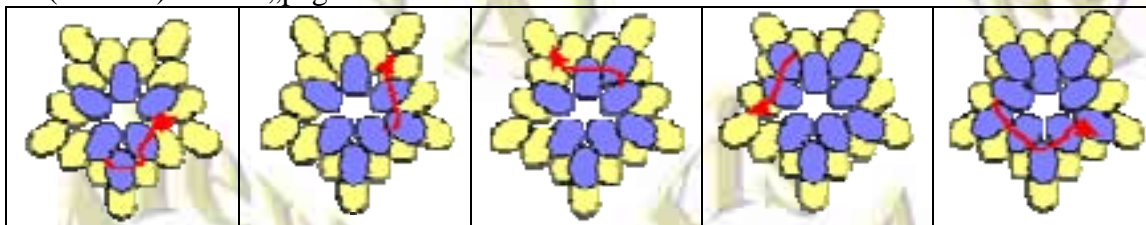
The way to the third row:



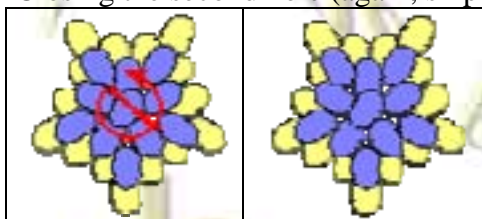
View from below (at the second picture the horizontal beads are left out for a better orientation):
