## Part 1 „Tornado cube“

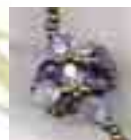





4 mm faceted beads (16) (I used 7 light blue and 9 purple.)



2 mm seed beads (size 11) bronze (24)

Nylonthread (0,25 mm)

1. This: * is the middle of the thread. Take four faceted beads and cross in the last one:	2. Take one bead on each thread end and cross in another one:
3. Repeat again and take again one bead on each thread end – but don't cross in a new one!	4. To make the cube you are now crossing in the bead that was in the middle of the thread at the first step:

<p>5. Now you are adding two seed beads between the faceted beads above and below and cross again in that first bead:</p>	<p>6. The embellishment is made with one thread: take a seed bead, a faceted bead, a seed bead and go through the next vertical faceted bead from below to above. Repeat that for all sides of the cube:</p>
	
<p>7. At the end you are going again through that first faceted bead (this is the last time, I promise ☺), through a faceted bead from the upper row and through the next vertical faceted bead. The second thread end goes through the next faceted bead of the lower row and you can knot the thread ends.</p>	<p>Here is the whole bead with my colour distribution:</p>
	

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
